1. Job interview

- Explanation: A formal meeting between a job candidate and an employer to discuss the candidate's qualifications and suitability for a position.

2. Job offer

- Explanation: A proposal made by an employer to a candidate to take a specific position, usually after a successful interview process.

3. Job satisfaction

- Explanation: A measure of how content an individual is with their job, encompassing feelings about the work itself, the environment, and compensation.

4. Job description

5. Job search

14. Job market

15. Job security

- Explanation: The assurance that an employee will continue to be employed for the foreseeable future, often linked to the stability of the company or industry.

16. Job fair

17. Job preview
